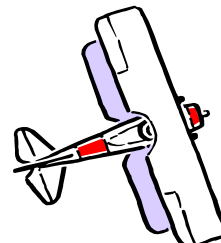
September 12th, 2005 Meeting Minutes

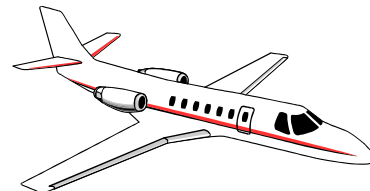
UPDATE ON BILLY GIBSON - **Billy Gibson** is home and would still love to have visitors.....give him a courtesy call before going over to visit.

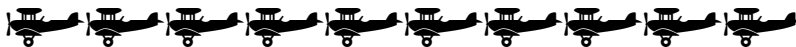

- The EAA Aeromedical Advisory Council advised the FAA to focus it's resources on the large backlog of special issuance cases instead of conducting a proposed survey to see if airmen are satisfied with the quality of service received from the Aerospace Medical

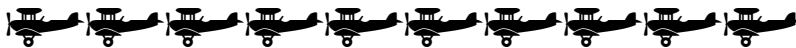

Certification Division - seems that there are between 100,000 and 140,000 Aeromedical applications awaiting action.

- The 9th Annual Virginia Regional EAA Fly-In is being held on October 1st and 2nd at Dinwiddie County Airport in Petersburg, VA.
- The Copperstate Regional EAA Fly-In will be held October 6-9 at it's new location, Casa Grande Municipal Airport in Arizona.
- Middleton Field in Evergreen, Alabama will host EAA's Southeast Regional Fly-In on October 7-9th.
- U.S. Sport Aviation Expo will be held Thursday, October 27 - Sunday, October 30 at Sebring Regional Airport, Florida.
- Robert Bushby (EAA 26), developer of the Midget Mustang and Mustang II kit planes will be inducted into the EAA Homebuilders Hall of Fame during ceremonies held October 21 at EAA headquarters, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.
- Millville Automated Flight Service Station was to be offline for at least two weeks due to an air conditioner having fallen through the roof of the building. Since then there has been discussion about not reopening the station at all because of the transition of FSS services to a private contractor in the near future. This has raised quite a bit of uproar among local pilots as there has been longer wait times for rerouted calls to be answered by a covering FSS and many radio frequencies are not being monitored, thereby lowering the service level of the service in this area.

- **Eli Liebermann** stated previously that his RV-6A was ready to be moved to Old Bridge Airport and that should have happened in September. Hopefully he'll have an updated report for us on the status of the move and reassembly of his plane.

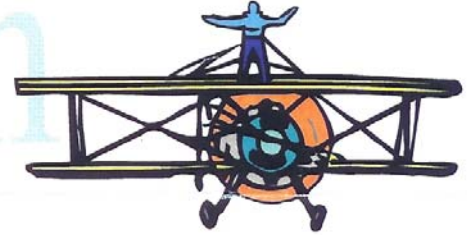

Pilot: I'm here for my check ride.

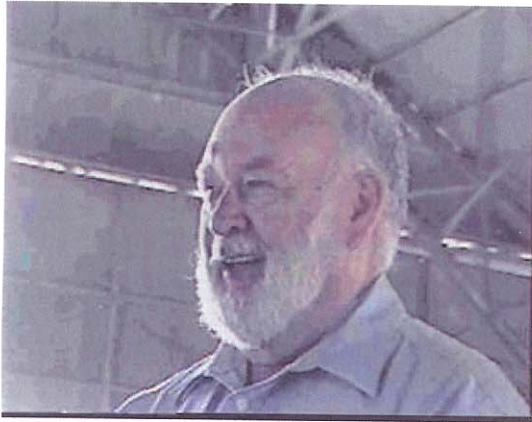

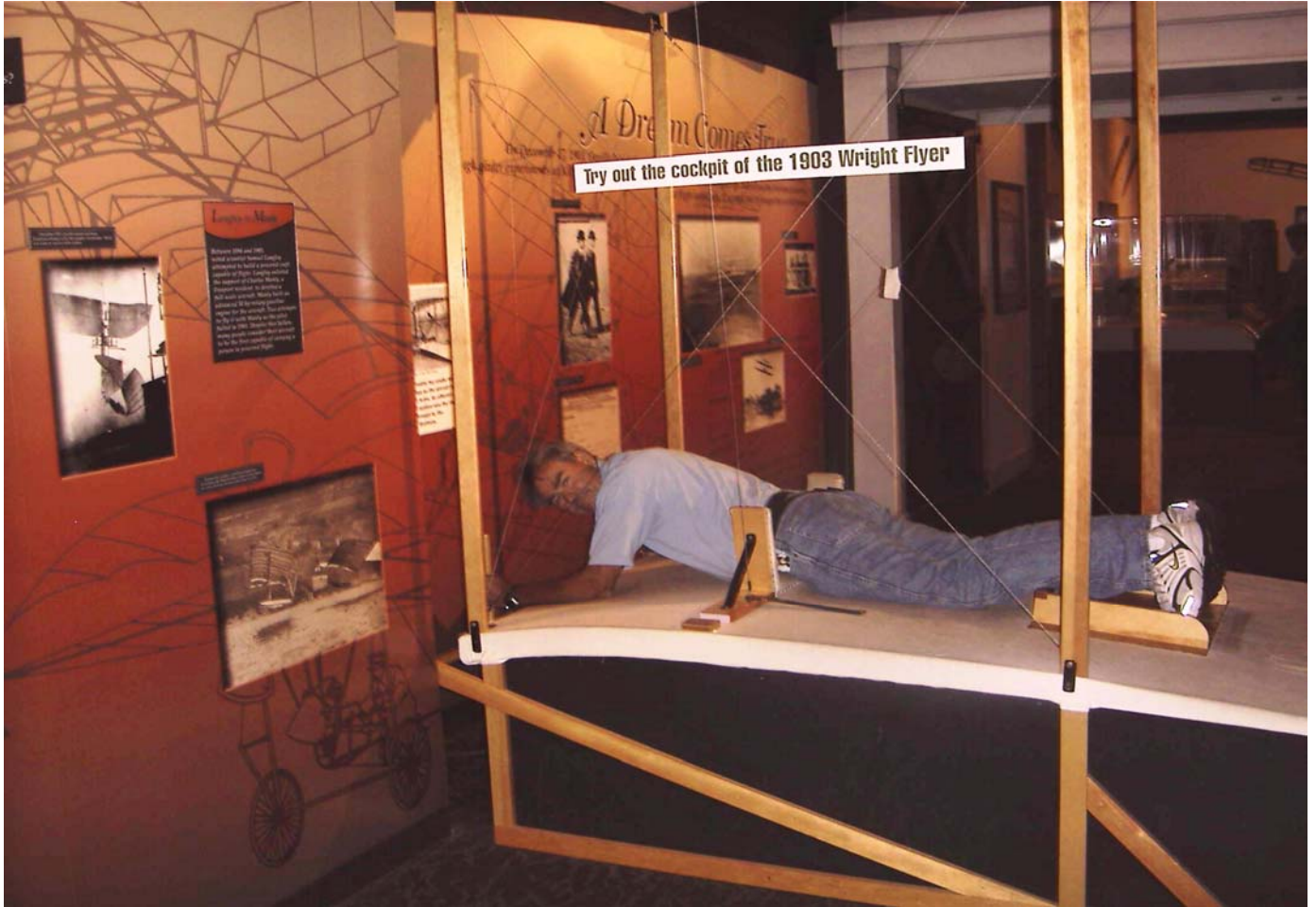

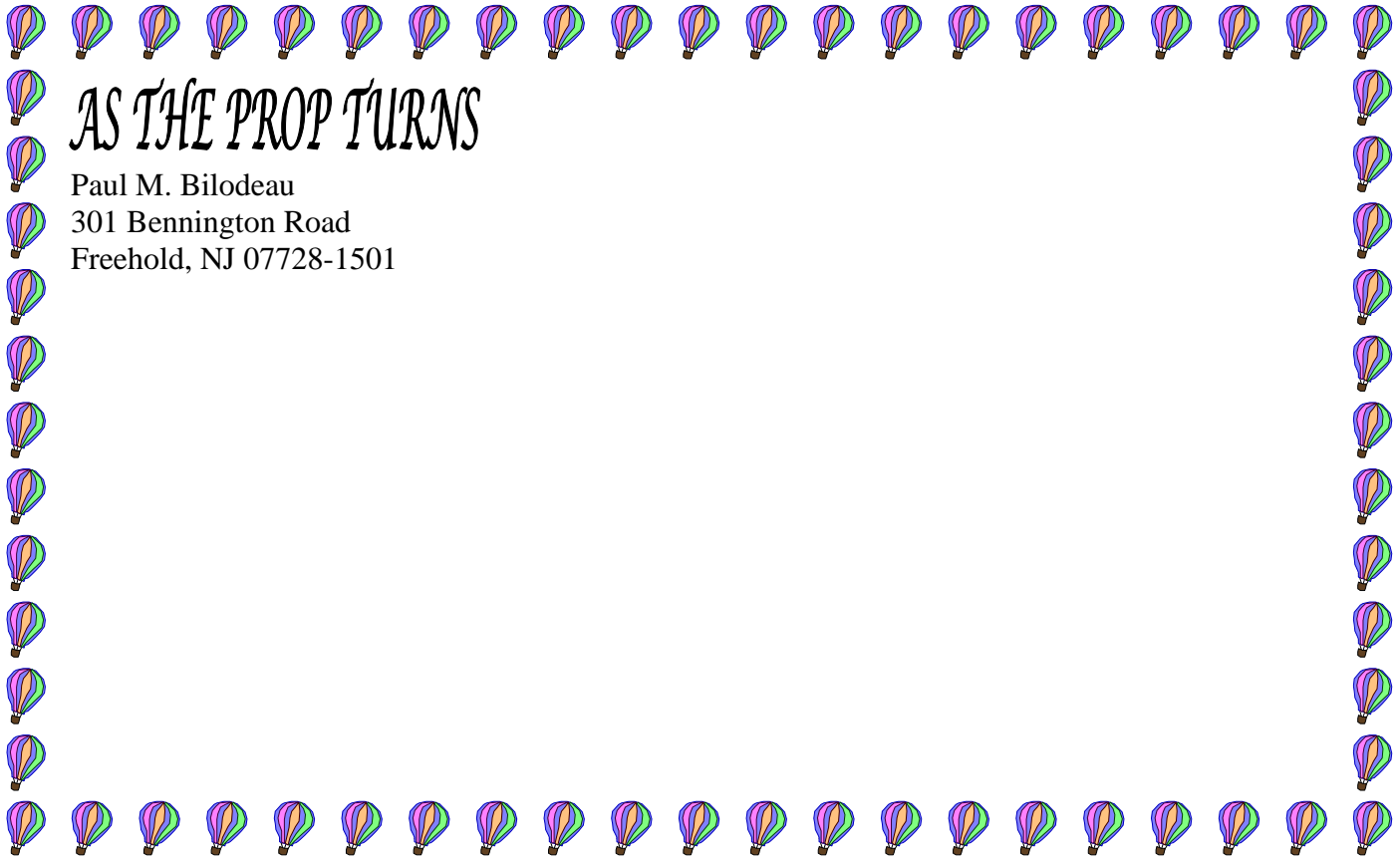
